



Bloodstock South Africa Online Conditions of Sales

- The highest bidder at the closing time of auction (displayed individually on each lots profile), will be deemed the Buyer of this lot.
- Any horse purchased that the Purchaser wishes to have scoped, will need to be done within 72 hours of purchase. If the horse fails the scope, the Purchaser has the option to cancel the sale.
- Any mare purchased that the Purchaser wishes to confirm being “Tested In Foal”, will need to be done within 72 hours of purchase. If the mare is found to be “Not In Foal”, the Purchaser has the option to cancel the sale.
- Any Thoroughbred sold to a Purchaser for a second career will need to have all the necessary documentation completed, as per the rules of the National Horseracing Authority of SA, prior to it leaving the Sellers yard.
- A horse will only be released to the new buyer once payment has been received by Bloodstock SA in full. We will then issue confirmation to both Seller & Purchaser to confirm release of the horse.
- Transport of horses purchased needs to be arranged by the Buyer directly after the sale. All transport costs and boarding fees from Conclusion of Sale will be for the Buyers account.
- All Buyers are to arrange insurance directly with the Insurance Broker of choice, if they wish to insure their purchase.
- B.S.A hold the right to cancel a sale, if the information provided on the online platform is incorrect.
- No bids placed on any horse during the auction will be cancelled. Please take care when placing your bids to ensure you are bidding on the correct horse.
