AHS Movement of horses post sale:

- There is no restriction of horse movement within the AHS infected areas of the country. If there is a major outbreak during a high risk period, the state vet may quarantine affected areas.
- All horses being moved into the AHS controlled areas (Protection, Surveillance and Free zones) require a movement permit.
- Horses which have received an AHS vaccine dose within the last 40 days cannot be moved into the AHS controlled areas mentioned until 40 days since the date of the last vaccine have lapsed.
- Horses that originate from an area where there has been a recent confirmed AHS
 case: if an isolated outbreak occurs, the horses that are resident in the 30 km radius
 of the outbreak will be under a movement ban for a minimum of 40 days after the
 outbreak case and will need to apply for a movement permit into the controlled
 areas: movement via negative AHS PCR on entry into quarantine, 14 day SOQ,
 negative PCR test on exit, OR wait for 40 days after the last reported case.
